RECIPE BY REQUEST **CAMPFIRE BANNOCK**

The campfire bannock was such a hit at the Swing & Skate event, we could hardly keep up with the demand. As requested, here is the recipe we used.

- 2.5 cups flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- ½ tsp. sugar
- ½ tsp. salt
- 3 tbsp. oil
- 1 cup water

Mix dry ingredients. Add oil and enough water to form a firm dough that doesn't stick to the hands. Leave to rest for 30

Divide into six portions and flatten with the palm of your hand to form discs. Select a long thin stick and clean off the end with a knife. Form the dough around the stick.

Scrape some of the coals out from the fire on to the edge of your fire pit. Hold the stick over the coals, turning frequently until your bannock is brown and cooked through.

You can also fry in lard, bacon fat or oil in a pan and sprinkle with sugar as a treat.


FLYING CANOE LANTERN MAKING WORKSHOP

Block Connections

A "THANK YOU" TO MY FURRY 4-LEGGED BLOCK CONNECTOR

have been a Block Connector since August of 2017. I was initially hesitant because like many of us, my wife and I have a hectic and busy life and I was concerned about taking on another responsibility. At the same time, I recognized that the strategy I was using to establish connections with neighbours wasn't working. It might come as a surprise but watching TV in your basement and then muttering to yourself that you don't know any of your neighbours does not lead to increased connection!

I had read about the Block Connecting program in the newsletter and it took about 3-4 editions for me to take the initiative to finally call Donna and get more information. I decided to take the plunge despite the fact I'm a bit of an introvert at heart. I went into the role with the hope that I would get to know my neighbours and help build some connections on our block. A year and a half in and I'm pleased to say that I made the right decision to get out of the basement (don't get me wrong, I still really like watching TV in the basement)! I went from knowing 3 people on my block to about 15 and counting. Mike (another Block Connector 4 houses down) and I have hosted a dinner for our neighbours at the hall and we also have somewhat of a

network on the block. This summer we had some car breakins where our block was able to support each other in staying alert and keeping things safe.

The reason for the title of this article is that I have 10 ½ year old Black Labrador Retriever, Jada, and I have to say she made it a lot easier for me to make some connections on the block. Ever since we've been in Laurier since 2011 the neighbours have seen either my wife or I walking Jada to Laurier Drive 1-2 times a day. For some reason it's often easier to start up conversations when dogs are around. You can ask how old they are, kids can ask for a "pet", you can talk about how good the dog park is, you can complain how they never come when you call, etc., etc.. Last Winter Jada and I met neighbours halfway down the block because they had a new puppy and we yelled hello across the street. We ended up having a lovely conversation in the middle of the street until a car came (sometimes Block

Connecting is a risky business!). As many people know, dogs get you out every day whether you need it or not and I find on our walks I can notice how many homes I now know the names of the families who live there.

So, as I write this today on February 2 and we just got 15+ cm of snow (we've already been out for our walk) I have to thank Jada for helping me establish some connections on the block. If you happen to see us out and about please say hello and/or ask "Is that Jada?" We'd be happy to stop for a chat. Also if you have any interest in learning more about the Bock Connector program or just figuring out who your nearest Block Connector is please feel free to send me an email and I'd be happy to support however I can. submitted by Mark Nicoll

Payments will be made online this year but your registration is not complete until your volunteer and uniform deposits have been received. Deposits for Laurier Heights are only required for players U9-U19. If your child is in a younger age division, you are not required to make deposits,

although you are always welcome

You must leave deposits in person, via cheque or cash at our community registration dates:

registration form and the player's Alberta Health Care Card or passport to verify birth date. If you are planning to coach or manage, please bring in a photocopy of any 2 pieces of government-issued ID and your completed Police Information Check and the Third Party Notification.

Please note that until deposits are received, player registration is not considered complete and your child will not be placed on a team. Any payments made after March 11th, 2019 will be subject to a \$50 late

registration fee. Registration fees do not include tournaments; how-

ever, they do include team photos.

For all players in age divisions U9-U19, the 2 post-dated cheques required are:

Black-Capped Chickadees

A FREQUENT AND BELOVED BACKYARD VISITOR, CHICKADEES CAN BE FOUND HERE ALL YEAR LONG

The annual Christmas Bird Count provides trend information for species in winter. Since 1906, 119 species have been recorded in Edmonton. 25 species have been seen only once, but the Black-capped Chickadee is the only species seen every year since counts were held. In fact, in 2003 the count for Black-capped Chickadees in Edmonton set a Canadian record.



Chickadees are a tough little bird that does not migrate. During cold weather Chickadees have been found to need twenty times more food than they do in summer. While Chickadees are regular visitors to feeders, over 75 to 80 percent of their winter food supply still comes from natural sources. Their overall winter diet is made up of such animal matter as spiders, dormant insects, and even carrion. But when the temperature falls below -12 degrees C, research has shown that the survival rate of chickadees almost doubled when they had access to feeders, which resulted in an overall higher winter survival rate of 69% versus a 37% survival rate for populations without access to feeders.

They are a favourite feeder bird for many and really enjoy sunflower seeds, as well as suet and even coconut. Have you noticed how ravenously the birds eat at your bird feeders, especially first thing in the morning and just before dusk? Chickadees can gain as much as 10 percent of their body weight each day and lose it all again during a cold winter night.

- · Chickadees usually mate for life.
- Black-capped chickadees keep an eye on the foodfinding success of other individuals, if one bird is doing especially well; they adapt their behaviour, whereas unproductive tactics are not copied.
- Chickadees are easily identified by their namesake call "chick-a-dee."
- They are a favourite feeder bird for many and really enjoy sunflower seeds.
- They are inquisitive and found in wooded areas.
- Chickadee's wing beats are about 27 times per second. This compares to a hummingbird's 80 beats per second.
- They are cavity nesters. They will excavate their own nest site in a rotten or decaying wood, use an old woodpecker hole or use a nesting box. Put some wood chips in your nesting box and watch the chickadee "excavate" the chips.
- Usually lay 6-8 white eggs with a light reddishbrown speckling.
- They hatch in about 12 days and fledge about 21 days later.
- · Chickadees weigh less than one-half of an ounce.
- The oldest banded Black-capped Chickadee recaptured in the wild had lived 12 years and 5 months.
- Each year in the Christmas Bird Count, Edmonton regularly counts more Black-capped Chickadees than other areas.
- The Black-capped generally sings out a "fee-bee" call while the Carolina Chickadee sings "fee-bee fee-bay;" however, this song is learned and, in overlapping territories, may be learned from the "wrong" bird.






