

Laurier Heights Civics Work

Canterbury Court will be undergoing an extensive renovation and de-velopment in the near future. The LHCL Civics Team will continue to work with Canterbury Founda-tion and with the developer (Stuart Olson) to provide input during logistics discussions related to traffic, noise and safety before and during the construction phase.

Canterbury staff was asked 2 years ago to move street parking along the west side of 141 Street and away from 142 Street to allow for less congestion on the busier street and to provide more parking and easier access to the front entrance for visitors.

Residents along 141 Street have expressed concerns with the increased traffic that is now along that street and the short-cutting and safety issues this presents to the neighbourhood.

After hearing from concerned residents, and in collaboration with Canterbury Court, and the City of Edmonton, there will be an implementation of further parking restrictions along 141 Street and 80th and 85th Avenues starting in May 2019.

i. The EAST side of 141 Street now has a 2 hour parking re-striction from 8 AM - 6 PM, Monday to Friday. This parking restriction also applies to the SOUTH side of 80 Avenue between 141 Street and 142 Street.

ii. In addition to this, a further 15 metre NO PARKING zone has been created at the northwest, northeast, and southwest corners of the 142 Street and 85 Avenue intersection. This is to ensure better sight lines for pedestrian and vehicular traffic at this busy crosswalk and intersection.

iii. A no-parking zone (1.5 meters on either side) has also been implemented at the sidewalk ramps on the west side of 141 Street (at the intersections of 82 and 84 Avenue).

Signage for these changes has already happened and these changes will be in effect for one year, with an interim review involving comments from adjacent residents to gauge the effectiveness of the parking restrictions. Parking Services will conduct the review in September 2019.

The Civics Team has also been in contact with Laurier
Heights School and its Parent Advisory Council and
have been working together to improve student safety along
142 Street. In February, the school started using orange
cones to mark the crosswalk at the front entrance of the
school to help eliminate crosswalk blockers and student
drop-off in non-designated drop spots (school staff parking
lot, Canterbury parking lots, etc.). In addition, the Parent
Advisory Council is creating a special committee to look at
short and long-term options to calm traffic and provide safe
access to and from the school for all its students and staff.

The City of Edmonton Traffic Pilot study to reduce shortcutting along 84 Avenue is being delayed until August 2019. The pilot program is for a left turn ban during peak hours at the 84 Avenue/149 Street intersection westbound. Councillor Hamilton's office sent out an update last month and stated the following:

"...several things have become clear since I first posed this pilot to your community. For one, the feedback we have collected tells us that there are strong feelings on both sides of this proposal and concerns about the way in which a final decision will be made. I have always said that it should be you, the residents of Laurier that decide how we should proceed when this pilot has run its course. To help facilitate a fair and equitable decision, our colleagues in the Office of Traffic Safe-ty are continuing to consult Public Engagement Advisors to build a plan so that residents can be confident in the decision-making process when that time comes.

Another factor that has been impressed upon me by members of the community are that the current proposal would not span any winter driving months, and that the majority would occur while school is out for the summer. We understand from residents along this problematic corridor that traffic patterns seem to change dramatically based on the road conditions and the school bell, and we want to ensure that those factors are reflected in the data we collect.

Administration has recommended that we delay the implementation of this pilot until August. With an August start, we will touch winter months with this pilot while also collecting traffic data in September when school begins again. This will also give the Office of Traffic Safe-ty more time to create a public engagement plan that we can all have confidence in."

The full letter was sent in a recent e-blast to the LHCL email list. Councillor Sarah Hamilton's office continues to be open to receiving direct feedback from Laurier Heights Residents about this project. Please contact her office directly at 780-496-8120, or email her at

The City of Edmonton has adopted a city-wide Affordable Housing Framework in an effort to meet the needs of struggling Edmonton households, with an aspirational target of 16% affordable housing in every neighbourhood in the City. The Edmonton Social Planning Council (ESPC) has been running targeted focus groups in every Community League District so that the city can understand the successes, challenges, and opportunities communities have encountered during engagement for housing development.



6. The purchase of the homes along 87 Avenue from 142 Street to 145 Street by a large developer group has hit some roadblocks and is no longer proceeding with this developer. The homeowners group is currently exploring other options for this project. The Civics Team will continue to monitor and update the community league as further details arise related to this project.

The Laurier Heights Civics team continues to work to address community matters that involve developers, local businesses and our city, and to update residents via the LHCL E-Blast notices and the community newsletter. Thank you.






