



Hall News: Heritage Room Update

THE OLD HALL, OR THE HERITAGE ROOM, AS IT IS NOW KNOWN, HAS SERVED THE LAURIER HEIGHTS COMMUNITY WELL FOR A VERY LONG TIME. BUILT IN THE 60'S, IT HAS HOUSED COUNTLESS BIRTHDAY PARTIES, HUNDREDS OF PLAY DATES, AND MANY IMPORTANT COMMUNITY FUNCTIONS AND EVENTS. IT HAS BEEN A GATHERING POINT, BRINGING THE COMMUNITY TOGETHER FOR OVER 50 YEARS.

ver the past year, a number of volunteers have been hard at work to secure funding for a much needed renovation to the old hall. We are happy to share with you that the city has approved our grant application, and that the renovations will soon move forward.

Based on the feedback we received from frequent users of the hall, and with a desire to improve building safety, we pitched a modest renovation scope to the city. The final budget is not big, meaning we really needed to pick our priorities and find a contractor willing to work with us to get the most out of our budget.

Our top priority is the kitchen. Too long have neighbours been limited in their cake selections based on the size of the hall fridge; the time of the apartment-sized range is over. It's time to have a functional modernized kitchen. As part of the kitchen reno, we will also be updating the electrical system in the old hall. This is both for safety and convenience. No one likes running to the rink shack when the breaker goes.

The second priority is to improve the washrooms in the hall. We have decided to do away with having gender-specific washrooms; we will have two nearly identical washrooms. We will remove the clunky, space consuming metal stall walls in each washroom and install locks on the outer doors instead. The extra space will allow us to install proper change tables in both washrooms and install new commercial toilets.

As with most renovations to existing older structures, it is difficult to predict all the issues a contractor may face. Therefore, if we have not exhausted our budget updating the kitchen and washrooms, our last priority is to improve storage in the hall and give the interior an update.

Though we have yet to set the project schedule, we hope to have everything completed before the spring. As we finalize our plans, the facilities team will do everything we can to minimize the impact the renovations will have on our regular users. Your patience and understanding will be appreciated. Should any planned event be affected by the reno, we will contact the organizer directly. Otherwise, look for updates regarding the renovation on the community league website and in future newsletters.

As one of the many volunteers working to make this happen, I am excited to see this project finished and to see people enjoy using the new space. I hope you are too.

This means that we care about high quality development plans and practices, public improvements to streets and parks, and other initiatives related to the environment, heritage preservation and community development. While not claiming to be the voice of the League, we are eager to, where possible, represent the community's perspective on a variety of concerns including traffic, wildlife and local planning and development issues. Our portfolios thus include Canterbury Development, Engagement Edmonton, Infill Development, and Development Permitting.

In all of these matters, we are mindful of the community's role in the overall development of Edmonton, including relationships with neighbouring communities and the policies of the Municipal Development Plan and Edmonton's transportation and utility master plans.

In the coming months we will meet with our Ward councillor, and next year we intend to prepare a long range neighbourhood plan.
