# Neighbourhood Matters This recognition of the significance of the local

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE **Karen Wilk,** LHCL President

was recently talking with a couple who reflected, "We've learned the importance of proximity especially with our move. It's really hard to keep up with former neighbours. We need a neighbourhood where you can go for coffee at your neighbours in your pajamas."

Neighbourhood Matters. In Edmonton, many City officials, civil servants, community leaders and neighbourhood boards like ours, are convinced of the power and significance of the local community for the social and personal well-being of citizens and the metropolis as a whole.1 Edmonton has a "Great Neighbourhoods" program, numerous "Go Local" emphases including a walkability index and the amazing Abundant Community Edmonton Initiative (ACE) in which Laurier is very involved. One of the foundational principles of ACE is 'human scale', that is, the importance of 'the block.' This is why, we are so excited about and thankful for our growing number of block connectors and the resulting connections, opportunities and groups that are forming. (Have you checked out any of them yet? -Monthly Potlucks, Talking Gardens, Nordic Walking, Sips and Tips, the Cigar Herf, Prayers and Ponderings, to name a few.)

This recognition of the power and significance of the local is also evident in our personal choices. For example, a young family new to our neighbourhood explained that they were planning to stay for twenty plus years! In contrast, when we moved to Edmonton (twenty plus years ago), we said, "two years max" as did most of our peers. Another family I talked with said that their move from another city (after seventeen years!) was precipitated not by a job but by a search "for a place to call home;

a community of people who cared about each other, that we could contribute to and feel a part of." Another neighbour marvelled at how, by just hanging out regularly at the local coffee shop, he

had "developed some significant relationships with neighbours." Another shared how as a young family moving into a new community, they had experienced the significance of 'next door' relationships. They described the communal dinners that happen regularly: "Everyone comes, feels welcome, included, like they belong ... and there is so much more to our life together, it's multidimensional."

Andy Crouch has concluded that while "the twentieth-century American dream was to move out and move up; the twenty-first century dream seems to be to put down deeper roots." Wendell Berry believes that "being rooted is perhaps the least recognized and most important need of humans."

In my opinion and experience, Laurier Heights is a pretty exceptional place to put down roots. It is my hope that an increasing number of our residents feel the same way.

I trust that you'll see indications of this throughout this newsletter and throughout the neighbourhood. In addition, I would love to hear your stories and responses: Why is 'going local' important to you? How has getting to know, connecting and doing life with your

neighbours made a difference in your life and for your household?

As Councilor
McKeen noted, "By
re-introducing
neighbour to
neighbour – and
neighbours to
the needs and

opportunities of community – we bring people back to where they always wanted to be: The Village."

Let's continue to work together to make the place we've "always wanted to be", the best it can be right here in Laurier.

### City Updates

EXCITING NEW CHANGES COMING TO BUENA VISTA AND SIR WILFRID LAURIER PARK

hen you visit Buena Vista and Sir Wilfird Laurier Parks this summer, be aware that you will encounter traffic detours and disruptions due to construction. The intention is to keep these disruptions to a minimum throughout the summer. Please be sure to observe flagpersons and construction signs at all times.

Construction of the many upgrades to the two parks will take place from spring until October of 2017. These upgrades include;

- · Yorath House and grounds redevelopment.
- Addition of a 20 stall parking lot near Yorath House.

- · Improved park signage.
- Replacement of washroom building at Laurier Park
- Replacement of 2 playgrounds at Laurie Park with 2 new "nature-based" playgrounds.
- Park amenity upgrades including 3 new picnic shelters, 2 viewing decks, upgraded granular trails and new asphalt shared used paths.
- Upgraded parking lots and increased parking stalls



Have you ever stopped to think about the different vehicles you see driving about our neighbourhood? Cars, trucks, SUVs and, in recent days, street sweepers. And, oh yes, service vehicles of all kinds. Lawn service companies, Purolator, UPS, furniture delivery trucks... the list goes on.

Let me turn back the hands of time for you to the early 1960's to have a look at what and who were seen in the neighbourhood back then.

First, there was always the milkman in his delivery van, with his ever-rattling glass bottles of milk stored in their boxes of ice. Primarily, the companies were Palm Dairy and Silverwoods Dairy. Oh my, that Silverwoods ice cream – so creamy and delicious! Then there were the dry cleaners: Todd's Dry Cleaning; Trudeau's Dry Cleaning; and, Page Dry Cleaners (in that bright pink van). How many of us kids entertained ourselves

making and popping bubbles from the plastic clothing covers.




