PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE WHAT ARE WE AFRAID OF?

Fear, unfortunately, has had a significant impact on our lives, influencing our decisions and often leading us to miss out on so much, including the joy and gift of knowing our neighbours! It's not surprising that we carry this fear since the news, political campaigns, conspiracy theories, social media, advertising, and so on, perpetuate and augment a culture of fear. When we're exposed to so much scary stuff, we begin to believe that anyone and everyone is a threat, but most of our fears are unfounded! The truth is, contrary to this messaging, our neighbours are people just like us-- doing the best they can to live healthy, happy, meaningful lives.

So how might we begin to consciously put aside our irrational fears and assumptions, and challenge ourselves and our households to meet our neighbours? Perhaps it starts with naming our fears. What are we afraid of? The unknown? Difference? Rejection? What's the worst thing that could happen, really? That a neighbour might respond negatively to our gesture of neighbourliness? According to Howard Lawrence, ACE (Abundant Community Edmonton) Consultant who has been knocking on neighbours' doors for years, this just doesn't happen, though sometimes, neighbours are afraid to open their doors--which only reinforces the need to crush these unfounded fears! A second question then might be, What would we do if we were not afraid? I'd delight in the opportunity to discover a friend nearby, to learn from them, to share with them and to be there for one another when an egg was needed, or plants required watering, I'd 'risk' getting involved and contributing my gifts, abilities, experiences, and passions such that I would appreciate and benefit from those of my neighbours as well. In fact, that's what's been happening as we have done so. Whether by initiating a chat with a neighbour in the lane or hosting an open house for the block, or being part of the Board, we have been amazed, inspired and so grateful for all the incredible people who are our neighbours: talented musicians, compassionate first responders, dedicated educators, passionate gardeners, cooks, water-skiers, and cyclists. We've heard remarkable



stories of diverse heritages, challenging journeys, and of finding the way through tragic and difficult circumstances. We've been gifted with wise elders, playful children, affectionate pets, and the comfort and security of knowing that we are here for another-- literally, right next door! A third question, which has, perhaps, become the most important one for me is, What would happen if I allowed love/neighborliness to prevail over fear? Could love be the motivation for stepping out of my comfort zone, ignoring my awkwardness and insecurities in order to discover and honour the unique beauty and goodness of you, my neighbour, and the wonder and joy of neighbourly care and connection? In most faith traditions, societies and cultures, love of neighbour is a central tenet, a primary calling and priority. Jesus said it was the greatest. One ancient text concludes, "There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear." Perhaps we could help one another drive out fear by together practicing (it takes practice, and courage) neighbourly love; there is no fear in love. Perhaps we could start today by, for instance, committing to introducing ourselves to at least one neighbour every week. And/or, to actually getting together with that household with whom we've repeatedly said, "we should get together sometime" And/or perhaps we could offer to share our skills, expertise and interests with our neighbourhood by volunteering for the Board, becoming a Block Connector, joining one of Laurier's Teams or groups... "Hi, I'm Karen. We live just over there (gestures and points in the direction of her home), we're neighbours! It's great to meet YOU! You have a beautiful garden... how long have you lived here? Do you know we have a Talking Gardens group?

SOLAR UPDATE

Do you notice anything unusual about Laurier Heights most recent utility bill (power, water and wastewater)? Don't worry, your eyes aren't playing tricks on you...that is a negative balance! Epcor owes us money again. With the installation of our 40.8kW solar array in September 2020 we are well on our way to recouping our out of pocket costs that went towards building our solar installation. This investment is not only lessening the financial burden of operating our Hall but so far we have reduced our CO2 emissions the equivalent of planting 478 trees, or driving 74858 km. We also continue to look for ways to reduce electricity usage and improve energy efficiency so that we can drive our costs down even further. Going green pays!

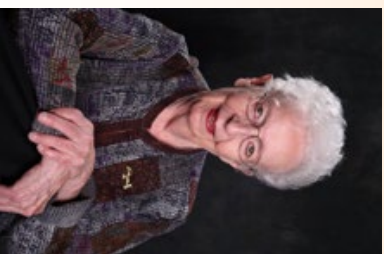
PROFESSOR ALEXANDRA MUNN

A MUSICAL MASTER

"MUSIC IS THE UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE OF MANKIND."
 HENRY WADSWORTH LONGFELLOW – 1835

No truer statement has been made than this oft-quoted assertion of Longfellow. And a remarkable example of eloquent ability and application of the language of music is found in the distinguished and celebrated career of Laurier Heights resident, Professor Emerita Alexandra Munn.

The record of Professor Munn's achievements and contributions to the music industry are considerable – dating from 1962, when Richard Eaton invited her to come to Edmonton for an eight-month term as a seasonal instructor in piano and related subjects. Remarkably, this eight-month term would last until 1991! Subsequently to this celebrated tenure, she became Chorus Director of the Edmonton Opera Association, the Da Cam-era Singers and, in 1968, conductor of the Richard Eaton Singers (formerly known as the University Singers). In 1992, she accepted a position with MacEwan University's Alberta College Conservatory of Music, where she continued to share her musical talents until she retired in 2018 at the age of 83. Woven into the years between, she was the Artistic Director of the Edmonton Bach Project, and she became a member of Edmonton's Cultural Hall of Fame, the YWCA Woman of the Year in the Arts, and a recipient of the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal.



One often wonders if excellence in any endeavour is the result of nature or nurture. For Professor Munn, her musical journey started at the tender age of four when she first sat at a piano. Her mother's brother had loaned her father \$50 to purchase the piano, with payments of \$5 a month and no interest charged. And, at 5 years of age, she began piano study in Calgary where her innate abilities soon became evident. She fondly remembers her primary teachers: Mrs. Lesingham Shortt; Dr. Gladys McKelvie Egbert; and, later, Erwin Freundlich of the Juilliard School of Music. Little did she realize how that \$50 piano, along with their instruction, would be the start of a lifetime of music.

For any teacher, when reflecting on former students, certain individuals often come to mind. Professor Munn

remembers one student who, ultimately, would become an important figure in her life: Jim Mahood. Professor Munn smiled as she recalled, "Jim was a young man who came from the University of British Columbia with one year under his belt, saying he wanted to go into piano performance. But he had no musical background, no technique and no repertoire. I asked him what do you want to do when you grow up? He said, an orthopedic surgeon!" Professor Munn said she told him, "If you listen to me, we can accomplish this together and, he did! And, eventually, he would also become an orthopedic surgeon. When I think of what this young man put himself through, I remember it as one of the most important events in my life."

As the years of playing went by, Professor Munn found herself in need of surgery on one of her hands. Specifically, she needed orthopedic surgery. Back into her life came Dr. Jim Mahood. He arranged for her surgery with one of his colleagues, Dr. Michael Mohart, who specialized in hand surgery. Soon, she was back at the keyboard in fine form.

Professor Munn says that although she has been blessed with many gifted students, it is has always been more important to her that they turned into first class human beings. Whether it turned out that piano or choir was their career path, or if they became a teacher or orthopedic surgeon, in the end, she was concerned about the character of the person as a whole. Given the many students who continue to update Professor Munn on their projects and achievements, it is clear her teaching nurtured not only their musical talent but also qualities that contribute to society as a whole. Perhaps it was the meaning behind the words Erwin Freundlich shared with her that she passed on to those she taught – "Whatever you do, you must do with all honesty."

And so, through a \$50 piano, some lessons and a lifetime of dedication, the musical gifts of Professor Alexandra Munn have reached far and wide, enriching the lives of those she has touched with the universal language of music. Let the music play!!!
