

One volunteer role that is having a positive impact with which you may be less familiar is that of "Coordinator of the Food Forest Steering Committee." Nurturing beauty and 'fruitfulness' on our Community League grounds, the dedicated and long time resident in this volunteer position is Marilyn Dale.

"Lynn" grew up in Fort Saskatchewan and started her schooling in a two story, four room schoolhouse. After completing her grade school education in what was then a small, tightly-knit community, she attended the University of Alberta, where she obtained her Bachelor of Arts degree in English, followed by a Bachelor of Education. With degrees in hand, Lynn started her two-year tenure as a teacher and librarian at Edmonton's Glengarry School.

Then, in 1965 Lynn and her husband, Doug, moved to Seattle, where she completed her Masters of Library Science (MLS). Four years later (in 1969), the young couple moved back to Edmonton, where Lynn took the position of Librarian at Oliver School. With her career solidly established, Lynn took leave from her position in 1970 to start her family; with daughter Erin arriving 1971, and son Mac in 1975.

Once the children were happily in school, Lynn decided it was time for her to get back to school too! She took a position at Westglen School teaching Library Skills, and the school's Academic Challenge Program. Then, when LaPerle School opened in 1964, Lynn transferred there, working as its Librarian and Academic Challenge Program instructor for a remarkable twenty years! One final move was in the books for Lynn. In 1998, she became Librarian at Windsor Park School. It was from here that, in 2002, after 35 years of teaching, Lynn retired.

Of course, in retirement, one can partake in one's hobbies. And with Lynn – you guessed it – she loves to read, as well as garden. Lynn says, "My grandfather had a Master's in Literature from McGill. We used to go for walks in the forest, and I learned a great deal from him on those walks." This is most likely where her passion for literature began, along with a deep appreciation for nature.

It is this appreciation of nature that provides Lynn with the impetus to be an ever-present worker and coordinator of the Laurier Heights food forest activities. Lynn recalls, "The idea of the food forest originally came from a River Valley Alliance gathering where I had a conversation with Karen Wilk (Laurier Heights Community League President) about planting an orchard. That conversation eventually brought the Laurier food forest to fruition."

Lynn regularly organizes Weeding Wednesdays and heads up the steering committee that plants the food forest, including the addition of new plants, trees and finishing the permaculture installation. She heartily invites "Come one, come all and bring a trowel," to the community league Food Forest, every second Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. Lynn notes that an upcoming project is putting in place plants that will be used to make tea. Watch for "Tea from the Forest" next year!

So, after a lifetime of teaching, we are fortunate to benefit from the skills and dedication of this lovely lady. Thank you, Lynn – see you at the food forest!!!
