WHAT WAS THE NAME OF THE ESTABLISHMENT AT THE SOUTH END OF 156 STREET THAT HAD A SWIMMING POOL, RACQUET COURTS, CURLING RINK AND STABLE? IT WAS OPEN FROM 1964 TO 1978. Hillcrest Country Club

WHAT WAS LOCATED ON THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF 156 STREET AND 87 AVENUE FROM 1949 – 1971? Starlite Drive-In Theatre

WHAT DAIRY COMPANIES SERVICED LAURIER HEIGHTS IN THE 1950S TO 1960S?
Palm Dairies and Silverwood Western Dairies

WHAT ICONIC SYMBOL WAS SILVERWOOD DAIRIES KNOWN FOR?

A 50 foot high milk bottle, located at 10175 109th Street

WHAT POST WAR ITEMS WERE LOCATED AROUND EDMONTON, WITH ONE OF THE LOCATIONS BEING AT 107 AVE AND 142 STREET?

Air raid sirens. These were officially called, "Civil Defence and National Survival Attack Warning System sirens". The network of attack warning sirens was installed in the 1950's in response to a Privy Council Order (PCO 1959-656) that a national attack warning system be implemented to warn citizens of a nuclear attack on the continent and to alert them to the presence of radioactive fallout. Only one is still in place. Apparently, Edmonton was the most well-prepared in Canada, alongside Ottawa and Vancouver."

WHAT SMALL BLUE AND WHITE STRUCTURE IS LOCATED BESIDE THE NORTHWEST ENTRY OF THE 142 STREET BRIDGE THAT PASSES OVER MCKENZIE RAVINE?

The Edmonton Civil Defense Bunker. Again, a post-war installation. Built in 1953, the 2,600-square-foot structure with 11-foot ceilings was the front line of Edmonton's civil defence. It was not designed to withstand a hit by a bomb, but it was designed to protect people from the fallout. It has been preserved as a museum. Civic employees who would be responsible for a post-bomb recovery were the people who would be allowed into the bunker.

WHAT WAS ORIGINALLY LOCATED ON THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE 149 STREET AND 87 AVENUE INTERSECTION? Safeway

WHAT WAS THE NICKNAME OF THE TUNNEL THAT WAS LOCATED ON 109 STREET AND PASSED UNDER 104 AVENUE? The Rat Hole.

WHAT WAS THE NAME OF THE WELL-KNOWN LAURIER HEIGHTS RESIDENT FROM THE 1950'S WHO OWNED A GAME FARM AND HAD A PET CHEETAH THAT HE TOOK TO SCHOOLS?

Al Oeming. The 1,400-acre facility started at Highway 14 and Range Road 223 and grew to house hundreds of exotic species. He especially featured wild cats, such as cheetahs, lions, and tigers.

Growing Goodness

GROWING GOODNESS IS AN INITIATIVE THAT BOTH RAISES MONEY AND HELPS GIVE FRESH PRODUCE TO EDMONTON'S FOOD BANK. IT'S A FANTASTIC IDEA HATCHED BY THREE BUDDING GRADE 4 LAURIER HEIGHTS ENTREPRENEURS WHO FIRST WON THE GIRLS CAN CONTEST AND ARE NOW EXECUTING THE PROJECT.

The original goal was to sell 50 kits (vegetable seeds and hand designed Growing Goodness garden sig) for \$10 each, with all proceeds being donated to Edmonton's Food Bank. In May they sold their last kit and achieved almost 90 kits sold this spring.

Presently, the seeds have been planted in gardens across our neighbourhood, and beyond.

At the end of the growing season, any harvested vegetables that can be spared can be dropped off at a convenient neighborhood location

> for delivery to Edmonton's Food Bank, or else can be delivered directly to their central depot.

id you know that Laurier Heights is the home of the current Tier IV provincial youth soccer champions? Laurier Heights U15B (Eadie), named LHFC, won Alberta Soccer's Indoor Provincials for the 2023-24 season. (In the previous year, LHFC brought home the silver medal in Indoor Provincials). Coached by Alex Eadie, Matt Tennant, Don Dehod, Angela Miller and Chris Sellar, the base players of this team have played indoor and outdoor soccer together for 15+ seasons. This undoubtedly has contributed to their team cohesion and success.

Tier IV soccer is the highest tier of community soccer, right behind the club tiers. Laurier has had the privilege of hosting teams in contention for Provincial Tier IV Champions with a couple of different teams over the years. In Indoor 2013-14 and Outdoor 2017, Laurier brought home

bronze medals in Provincials and then went on to win a silver in 2018, all with the Laurier (Misiaszek) team. Hot on the heels of a fabulous indoor season, Laurier U9B (Wesley-Firt) went undefeated and had a 15-0-0 season. We can't wait to see how your outdoor season goes! Is this the beginning of a Laurier dynasty?

This outdoor season, Laurier is hosting 12 teams with 167 players. With the help of a dedicated group of 39 team officials, we are able to make soccer a reality in our vibrant community!

Laurier Heights is a community that takes pride in its soccer accomplishments, and with a legacy of success and a strong foundation of dedicated players and officials, the future looks bright for our soccer players.

The local band some jazz playing Toes tapping, fingers snapping... Helping me to appreciate


The simple, the nearby, the really great So, let's enjoy and celebrate!

Facilities Update

One important duty of your LHCL Board is to be responsible stewards of community assets, including the bank account. For this reason, I have recently switched our electricity retailer to one of the highest priced retailers that I could find.

Does that sound right to you? The HIGHEST price? It's true, and it's working out great!

Our solar array produces approximately as much electricity as we use in a year, but due to seasonal variances, we under-produce in the winter (and buy electricity as needed) and we overproduce in the summer (and sell all of the surplus). And now that we are officially in the selling season, we make a LOT more money selling at the highest price. Our old retailer paid us about \$212 for the month of April 2022, while our new retailer paid us about \$831!

You might expect that this would be negated in the winter when we switch over to our buying season and you would be right...except that the arrangement we have with our retailer allows us to switch to a market competitive rate once per year. So for LHCL, it's win-win!

In summary, we buy electricity at a competitive market price, and sell at a through-the-roof price. If you want more information about this program feel free to email facilities@LHCL.ca
