In a Gift Economy...

A hunter [from a hunter-gatherer community in the Brazilian rainforest] had brought home a sizable kill, far too much to be eaten by his family. The researcher [Daniel Everett] asked how he would store the excess. Smoking and drying technologies were well known; storing was possible. The hunter was puzzled by the question-store the meat? Why would he do that? Instead, he sent out an invitation to a feast, and soon the neighboring families were gathered around his fire, until every last morsel was consumed. This seemed like behavior maladaptive anthropologist, who asked again: given the uncertainty of meat in the forest, why didn't he store the meat for himself, which is what the economic system of his home culture would predict.

"Store my meat? I store my meat in the belly of my brother," replied the hunter.*

And Laurier is learning to 'store our meat in the belly of our neighbours!' From the Buy Nothing group to our block connecting, to our various clubs, initiatives (like the Food Forest), and so many of our events and programs, we are learning—as you'll discover as you read the articles, updates, reflections and expressions of gratitude in this issue—that we are nurturing and participating in 'a gift economy' like the hunter in the story.

In a gift economy, wealth is understood as having enough to share, and the practice for dealing with abundance is to give it away. In fact, status is determined not by how much one accumulates, but by how much one gives away. The currency in a gift economy is relationship, which is expressed as gratitude, interdependence and the ongoing cycles of reciprocity. A gift economy nurtures the community bonds that enhance mutual well-being; economic unit is "we" rather than "I," as all flourishing is mutual.*

We are together enhancing our collective well-being and recognizing that the more we give, the more we have and that sharing our gifts—whether time, talent or treasure—is not only a gift for others, it is a gift for ourselves. As Laurier becomes a more abundant, vibrant and caring community, we experience the joy of participating in the giving and the receiving, the reciprocity, relationships and interdependence of an economy of community.

So perhaps as we consider hopes, dreams and desires for the year ahead personally, we might also do so communally. If our desire, hope and dream for Laurier in 2024 is to nurture a gift economy, what's our next step—what might be your next step? How about...

LIFTING The hard way!

Have you ever said to yourself, "I can't believe I lifted that!"? Well, there is a Laurier Heights resident who prides himself on being able to lift a deadweight beyond the average person's wildest imagination.

Dave Nisbet's day job is that of a first responder. As one can imagine, being physically fit is a requirement of this job. However, Dave takes his fitness to the next level. He notes, "I have many hobbies, but the one that takes up most of my time is strength training." For eight years, he has been an active participant in power lifting and strong man competitions. But when Covid came along in 2019, it shut down these events. Needing to stay active, Dave continued his strength training, with a focus on improving his grip strength training. This led him into breaking horseshoes with his hands! Through social media, he met others from around the world who participate in this sport, and he quickly rose to the top by establishing a world record in timed horseshoe breaking. His best time is an amazing 44 seconds



With his success in horseshoe breaking firmly established, Dave turned his focus to his other hobby, lifting stones – heavy ones! Dave notes that one of the most difficult feats in a strong man competition is natural stone lifting. "I saw a documentary, called 'Stoneland', about historical stone lifting in Scotland. Having Scottish heritage, it caught my interest right away." Historically, stone lifting was associated with a test of manhood. As Dave researched this sport further, he found that it is a world-wide activity. Some countries, such as Scotland, Ireland, Iceland, and Spain, have a long history of stone lifting and still host lifting competitions with 800+ year old stones.

In 2023, Dave travelled to Scotland to try his hand at lifting the famous Dinnie Stones. Individually, these stones weigh 414 lbs. and 318 lbs. Each one has a large iron loop fastened to its top and, to record a successful lift, the lifter must have a Dinnie stone on each side, bend to grasp the loops and then stand erect with a stone in each hand, holding for two seconds to show control.

LIFTING STONES



On September 13, 2022, Dave lifted these stones and went into the record book as the first western Canadian to have completed this feat. (Congratulations, Dave-wow!)

Back home, Dave has continued to increase the weight of the individual stones he lifts. To date, his heaviest stone lift, held at chest height, is a remarkable 409 lbs.

Lifting these stones is no easy undertaking. Dave outlined the process, explaining, "The initial lift of the stone off the ground is done by breaking it from the ground (the Scottish saying is 'putting wind beneath the stone'), then lapping the stone (in this position, grip adjustments can be made), and, finally, standing and bringing the stone to chest height. In some competitions, the stone can also be put onto the shoulder, with a pause before dropping it – this demonstrates 'control'." Strength, fitness, and sheer determination are a few of the prerequisites for this sport that is open to both men and women. In fact, Dave notes that a couple of Edmonton women are lifting stones heavier than some of the men can lift!

This sport is gaining world-wide attention. Dave was recently interviewed by the Globe and Mail newspaper. For those readers who are interested in seeing and learning more about local stone lifting, Dave recommends visiting: "Edmonton Stones of Strength", on Instagram.


